University of Alberta awards NRC Chairman Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree

On June 15, 2011, NRC Chairman and President of the Kitikmeot Inuit Association, Charlie Evalik, received an honorary Doctor of Laws degree from the University of Alberta for his significant and varied contributions to the political and economic development of Nunavut. In addition to receiving the degree, he was furthered honoured by being granted the privilege to deliver the convocation address to the 2011 graduating class.

Besides the large number of Chairman Evalik's friends and family members in attendance, the convocation ceremony was also attended by representatives of the Federal Government, most notably, the Honourable Leona Aglukkaq, M.P. for Nunavut, and Senator for Nunavut, Dennis Patterson. Minister Aglukkaq gave a warm opening speech that acknowledged the years of service that Chairman Evalik has dedicated to empowering Nunavut's Inuit and to improving their social outlook.

Chairman Evalik's convocation address dwelt on a number of topics, including the rapid transforma-

tion of Inuit society since the 1950's, as well as the role of the *Nunavut Land Claims Agreement* as a vehicle to enable Inuit to better determine their own destinies. However, the key focus of his speech was on the importance of education, especially for Inuit. Chairman Evalik told the audience, "Education is an essential building block for success in any society, and in Nunavut, improved educational achievement will be essential to enable Inuit to build the lives they want, so they too can contribute to their families and communities as leaders in their homeland. In order to play a central role in the future of Nunavut and Canada, Inuit must have the educational skills needed to innovate, compete and govern. A lot of hard work and leadership will be required if Inuit are to achieve these goals."

Chairman Evalik specifically identified the importance of education as being necessary to manage the significant social, political and environmental changes occurring in the arctic. He concluded on the theme of Inuit working together with

other Canadians, noting "Inuit survived in a harsh environment because they learned to work together and to share. To build the future of Nunavut we are ready to share and to work with all Canadians. I hope some of you who are graduating today will come north looking for adventure and opportunity. Maybe you will stay with us to make your homes and lives in Nunavut. I look forward to seeing you there and to welcoming you to the land which will be a crucial part of Canada's future."

The University of Alberta and Canada's North

Given that the City of Edmonton is also known as the "Gateway to the North", it should be no surprise that Edmonton's own University of Alberta has forged durable and long-lasting relationships with the North and its people. In particular, the University of Alberta's Canadian Circumpolar Institute (CCI) has become one of the country's premier institutions for the multi-disciplinary study of Arctic and Antarctic regions. In 1990, after 30 years of operation as the Boreal Institute for Northern Studies, the Institute was reorganized to respond to emerging needs arising from tremendous social, cultural, political and environmental changes in the North.
